

Explore Quay Place

St Mary at the Quay (Quay Place) has a rich and varied history spanning over 500 years. Explore the stories of the Grade II listed church, discover its hidden features and become acquainted with the people who have been part of the journey.



Listen to a story

Travel back in time and meet our soldier, Captain Douglas Nicholls. He will tell you his stories of life during the First World War and about the impact the war had on Ipswich. Find out more about Captain Nicholls' significance to Quay Place.

Discover and learn

During your trip, you will take part in three activities based around the curriculum:

- I. Timeline Captain Douglas Nicholls' life.
- 2. Take part in our Poppy Project. Volunteers and visitors at Quay Place are making poppies to commemorate the lives that were lost in the First World War.
- 3. Build a trench with your team. Your trench needs to be able to withstand different tasks.







How to get here
